

Mark Prine Biography

John “Mark” Prine was commissioned a Second Lieutenant through the Army Reserve Officer Training Program (ROTC) at the University of Southern Mississippi. During his military service, Mark served as a Platoon Leader, Company Commander, Band Commander, and Battalion Commander. As a Logistics Staff Officer, Mark served as the Chief Logistics Officer for the 377th Theater Sustainment



Command, Support Operation Officer for United States Army Central Command (Forward), Deputy Commander for Joint Sustainment Command-Afghanistan, Project Leader for the International Security Assistance Force-Afghanistan’s “Task Force Phoenix” developing a logistics training plan for the Afghan National Security Forces, Commander of Joint Task Force-Magnolia (Hurricane Katrina), and the National Guard Bureau’s representative at the Army Logistics University.

As a full-time employee of the Mississippi Army National Guard, Mark served as an Operations and Training Officer, Chief of the Material Readiness, Superintendent of the Maneuver Area Training Equipment Site (MATES, Superintendent of the Combined Support Maintenance Shop (CSMS), a Major Subordinate Command Officer-in-Charge, and Surface Maintenance Manager. After retirement at the rank of Colonel, Mark has served as an adjunct faculty member for Jones County Junior College, Pearl River Community College, and William Carey University. Mark is currently serving as an adjunct faculty member at the University of Southern Mississippi and as the Special Projects Officer for the Commander, Camp Shelby Joint Forces Training Center.
